Course Description

In this course, we will delve into the profound impact of *One Hundred Years of Solitude* (1967). Authored by the Colombian Nobel Prize-winning writer Gabriel García Márquez (1927-2014), this novel has been hailed by Yale literary scholar Harold Bloom as "the new Don Quixote." With translations into 46 languages and an astonishing 50 million copies sold, it stands as the most translated Spanish literary work after *Don Quixote*.

To develop a nuanced comprehension of García Márquez's literary journey and the world he crafted, we will explore a selection of his earlier short stories. By examining the author's life alongside his literary contributions, we will gain insights into his "magical" sensibility and enduring commitment to equality and social justice, shaped by his challenging upbringing.

This course takes a deliberate approach, eschewing a hurried reading of *One Hundred Years of Solitude*. Instead, it fosters an appreciation for the pleasure of immersing oneself in a remarkable text. We'll delve into magical realism as a literary technique to unravel the novel's deep-seated themes, such as identity, historical repetition, the pursuit of knowledge, circularity of time, as well as the exploration of love, sexuality, and solitude.
